FRANKSTON SPECIAL DEVELOPMENTAL SCHOOL DUTY OF CARE POLICY

Rationale

Frankston Special Developmental School owes a legal duty of care to all students. This requires staff to take such measures as are reasonable to protect students from injury that could have been reasonably foreseen.

Aim

- To provide suitable and safe premises
- To provide an adequate system of supervision
- To implement strategies to prevent bullying
- To ensure medical assistance is provided to sick or injured students

Implementation

- Frankston SDS will follow the Department of Education and Training (DET) Occupational Health and Safety Management System in order to provide a suitable and safe environment for students
- Appropriate ratios of qualified staff will be allocated to activities, playgrounds and excursions/camps to
 ensure appropriate levels of supervision are maintained for student safety. These ratios will take into
 account:
 - the experience, qualifications and skills of staff (including volunteers, instructors, etc)
 - o the age, maturity, physical characteristics and gender of students
 - o the ability and experience of the students
 - o the size of the group
 - any other relevant factors
- Frankston SDS will promote the welfare of students through:
 - o Implementing a School-Wide Positive Behavior approach to welfare and discipline
 - Complying with the *Disability Standards for Education*; in particular preventing bullying, harassment and victimization
 - Providing qualified first aid staff to support sick or injured students
- Staff will endeavor to ensure the safety of students by taking a *risk assessment approach* to planning all school activities, both in and out of the school grounds
- Staff will document accidents and injuries to students on CASES 21, in line with DET policy
- Parents/Carers will be informed regular playground supervision hours and that no formal supervision of the grounds occur outside those hours
